RE: Wildlife in Esplanade Preserves

#### Drew,

This memo is in reference to our telephone conversation last week regarding the preserves and wildlife located within the preserves. As you are aware, the project has over 1,000 acres of contiguous preserve located to the north and west of the development and contributes to a contiguous corridor of preserved lands that runs from Immokalee Road all the way out to the CREW Trust lands off of Corkscrew Road (over 22 miles). Attached is a list of species which have been documented within the preserve lands of Esplanade. It is not a complete listing but shows the wide variety of fauna that can be found out in the preserves.

Of special note are the listed species that have been documented. Big Cypress fox squirrels, bald eagles, wood storks, and snail kites have all been observed. In addition, Florida panthers have been documented to the east and west of the property so it must be assumed that they can on occasion cross travel through the preserve.

I think that an interpretational program could be developed to educate residents about the wildlife in their backyard and generate interest as well as a sense of stewardship towards the preserves. The program could include a marked trail or trails within the preserve, pamphlets describing the preserves with notable locations along the trail(s), and occasional guided walks or talks regarding the wildlife around the area.
